Vale David Kirkman (25 July 1936 to 19 November 2019).

It is sad to report the passing of member David Kirkman, aged 83 years, who succumbed to cancer at David Berry Hospice early on 19 November, 2019. David had a relatively short illness, having been diagnosed with a rare and aggressive cancer at Wollongong Hospital before his transfer last week to Barry.

David was a member of the Probus Club of Kiama from 2012 and was a valued member of the Kiama Men's Probus Choir. He was an excellent violinist and also painted in oils. He was previously the President, Secretary and Bulletin Editor of the Kiama Mixed Probus Club and was a member of the Lions Clubs in both Nowra and Kiama for more than 35 years. His career was in the Post Office, spanning more than 44 years, serving in Bathurst, Nowra, Warilla and Kiama, where he was the Postmaster from 1986 to 1994.

David was married to Elaine and we extend our condolences to her, to their children and to their extended family. His funeral is tentatively planned for Friday, 29 November 2019.

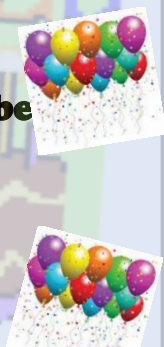
