

COVID Corner



I assume that most of you, if not all, will have by now had your first vaccination, which is great news!!

At long last there is a glimmer of light at the end of the tunnel. If the Governments plans go as expected, then we will see a phased releasing of the lockdown restrictions over the next three months. Below is a summary of the relevant details of each stage that will provide a helpful reminder. Full details of the plan can be found on our Probus website.

What's already changed?

Two people from different households can meet outside for recreation, which can include "a coffee on a bench"

From 29 March:

- People will be allowed to meet outside, either with one other household or within the "rule of six", including in private gardens
- The stay at home rule will end, but the government will urge people to stay local as much as possible
- Outdoor sport facilities will reopen, including golf courses and tennis and basketball courts, and formally organised outdoor sports can restart

Stage two (no earlier than 12 April):

- All shops allowed to open, along with close-contact services, including hairdressers and beauty salons (including in people's homes)
- Restaurants and pubs allowed to serve food and alcohol to customers sitting outdoors
- Gyms and spas can reopen, as can zoos, theme parks, libraries and community centres
- Members of the same household can take a holiday in the UK in self-contained accommodation

Stage three (no earlier than 17 May):

- People can meet in groups of up to 30 outdoors
- Six people or two households can meet indoors
- Pubs, restaurants and other hospitality venues can seat customers indoors
- Hotels, hostels and B&Bs can reopen
- Adult indoor group sports and exercise classes can restart

Stage four (no earlier than 21 June):

- All legal limits on social contact will be removed
- No legal limits on the number of people who can attend weddings, funerals and other live events

Once again, if any member is experiencing difficulties or requires assistance please do not hesitate to contact your allotted committee member and we will do all we can to help.

This month we feature this 100-year-old structure.

You have probably been walking past these giant ornate poles for years without knowing what they are.

The humble stink pipe, also known as stench pipes, or sewer vent pipes, have been a curious feature of our highways since the late 18th century, when our sewage systems were far from sophisticated.


Although most are disguised as brick chimneys or metal columns looking a bit like lamp posts, some are ornately decorated with gold etchings and elaborate engravings.

There is even one disguised as a lamp in the Barbican which was once lit with sewer gas.

Stink pipes were built around the same time as the capital's Victorian sewer network in the 1860s. They are essentially just tall, hollow pipes that allow potentially lethal gas to escape into the atmosphere, far above the rooftops.

The era of the stink pipe is pretty much over, primarily because modern houses have individual vent pipes positioned discretely amid the plumbing, but you can still find some of these interesting pipes dotted about the highway. I'm told that some water authorities still maintain some of the pipes in their region.

Finance Report from Tony Rudd



As a starter I am considering organising a welcome-back Afternoon Tea event at the Golf Club towards the end of June. Details to follow.


I have been in touch with Warner's Hotels regarding a Group Holiday. They have availability at Thoresby Hall during the 2nd or 3rd week in October.


